






Head lice alert

Once again these little critters are doing the rounds of our community. Please ensure you check and treat each child if necessary. There are a multitude of products available (shampoos) and remember that a once off treatment isn't enough. Combing the nits (louse eggs) out of the hair with a very fine toothed comb is recommended daily for 14 days. A 2nd treatment shampoo is recommended 7 days after the first treatment. Everyone co-operating and following through is the only way to break the cycle.

Handwriting Help

What can teachers do?

- · Allow breaks in class when writing.
- · Allow more time for assessments/tests, eg. start early and finish with others.
- · Provide keyboard opportunities where appropriate.
- Reduce copying from the board activities, provide worksheets/handouts.
- When marking work, remove neatness/spelling from the criteria.
- · Teach note taking by providing 'notes with gaps'
- Let the student use print or cursive whatever is easier.
- Use graph paper for maths so that lining up numbers is easier.
- · Minimise writing expectations in assessments, eg. use short answer, sentence.
- · Provide group work opportunities they talk and others can write.
- · Offer different options for assessment, eg. powerpoint, speech, etc.

Fine Motor Skill Activities for Younger Students

Class activities:

- Jigsaw puzzles
- · Sorting and threading small items
- · Games with slots/holes
- Weaving paper/ribbon strips
- · Using stickers, scissors, glue, etc
- · Eating food with toothpicks
- · Tying laces, doing buttons/zips up
- Pass the parcel opening practice
- Cut paper strip people/snowflakes
- · Join the dot games
- Use a dropper with food colouring

Fine Motor Skills Activities for Older Students

Class activities:

- · Scrunch paper into a tight ball
- Origami
- · Roll play-doh/blu-tack into small balls using thumb, index and middle finger
- · Eating with chopsticks
- · Art using their hands, eg clay, sculpting
- · Play an instrument, eg. recorder, quitar
- Model building
- Jewellery making
