Principal News Last day of Term 4 for students is Friday 16 December 2022

As we near the end of the year, I want to thank you for your ongoing support and notify you of a date change for the last day of Term 4 classes.

Students will now finish school on Friday 16 December 2022.

This is due to an additional School Development Day announced for staff across NSW public schools.

School Development Days allow our staff to participate in professional learning that was put on hold due to COVID-19 staffing pressures and plan ahead for 2023 to ensure we meet the needs of our students.

With this change, we ask that you arrange alternative care for your child on Monday 19 December.

<u>Arrival:</u> Suggested time is 9:15am - College Road.

Meeting point: The School Hall

<u>On the day:</u> Students should wear full primary school uniform, covered shoes/sport shoes and have a hat. **On 22 November** Parents/Carers are invited to attend the first session to meet the campus Principal and year advisor. A light snack will be provided at recess and a BBQ will be provided at lunch. Please advise the school (Lismore High) of any dietary requirements on 6621 5185. Remember to bring a hat, water bottle, and pen/pencil case. **On 29 November** students will need to bring their own morning tea and lunch as well as any other snacks. Don't forget your water bottle and a hat.

Richmond River High Campus

Arrival: Suggested time is 9:20am -Military Road

<u>Meeting point:</u> The MPH (LHC site) Please park in the SCU car park and access the campus via the single gate on Military Rd

<u>On the day:</u> Students should wear full primary school uniform, covered shoes/sports shoes and have a hat. **On 22 November** Parents/Carers are welcome to accompany their child to the MPH for the welcome, staying to 10am. Parents will then leave and are invited to return for a school open afternoon at 3:15pm where they can visit our classrooms and meet teachers). A light snack will be provided at recess and a BBQ will be provided at lunch. These will include gluten-free and vegetarian options. Remember to bring a hat, water bottle, and pen/pencil case. **On 29 November** students will need to bring their own morning tea and lunch. Remember to bring a water bottle, and pen/pencil case.

<u>Departure</u>: School ends at 3:15pm. Students being picked up by parents should be collected from Military Road. Students travelling by bus will be escorted down and supervised at Dalley Street bus bay.

Attendance

Regular attendance is important to promoting student wellbeing and strong learning outcomes. Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. This can be done through replying to the text message received when the student is absent, emailing the school or a handwritten note. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified.

Partial Absences

On occasions parents may need to pick their child up early from school or drop their child off late. It is important that appointments are made outside of school hours where possible to minimise the impact of partial absences on learning. Our school has recently made changes to our signing/signing out procedures as part of our new attendance system.

Late arrivals - If you need to sign-in your child late, please accompany your child to front office. Office staff will ask for a reason for the partial absence and then a slip will be taken by the student to the classroom teacher.

Early departures - Should you need to pick up your child early from school please report to the front office. The office staff will ask for the reason for early departure and record this on our system. The classroom will then be contacted to send the student to the front office for pick up.
