#### Supporting your child with Literacy and Numeracy

A strong connection between learning at school and home strengthens learning, particularly in the areas of literacy and numeracy. There are many ways families can support their child learning at home in quick and effective ways. Over the next few editions of our bulletin we will provide useful information to families may be able to use to help their child's learning.

#### Speaking and listening

Speaking and listening skills build the foundation for your child's learning at school. These skills help a child to be able to talk with others, create friendships and actively participate in all activities at school. If you speak a language other than English at home, it is important you continue to support your child to use their home language.

Useful strategies:

• Talk with your child about a range of topics, for example things that happen each day.

- Share stories from your culture, your own stories and your children's stories.
- Describe or talk about things as they are happening. For example, "We are going to walk to school today and go past the park."
- Listen to your child and encourage them to take turns. Show how to listen and interact in a conversation.
- When starting a conversation or when talking with your child ask questions that require more than a yes or no reply. For example, "What did you do at school today?"
- Use questions that start with how or why. For example, "How many birds do you see in the park?" • When asking questions give your child time to answer.

• Make conversations fun. Make up funny or nonsense rhymes, talk and sing with your child.
