A Reminder about Attendance

This year our teachers and the Learning Support Team will be working closely together to promote strong attendance across Blakebrook Public School. Ensuring students are at school as much as possible has a significant impact on academic and social development for children. NSW Department of Education Policy states: Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

 \cdot being sick or having an infectious disease

- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- · being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. This can be done through replying to the text message received when the student is absent, emailing the school or a handwritten note. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified. If an unsatisfactory reason is provided, the absence will be recorded as **explained - unjustified**.

Partial Absences

On occasions parents may need to pick their child up early from school or drop their child off late. It is important that appointments are made outside of school hours where possible to minimise the impact of partial absences on learning.

Late arrivals - If you need to sign-in your child late, please accompany your child to front office. Office staff will ask for a reason for the partial absence and then a slip will be taken by the student to the classroom teacher.

Early departures - Should you need to pick up your child early from school please report to the front office. The office staff will ask for the reason for early departure and record this on our system. The classroom will then be contacted to send the student to the front office for pick up.

Extended Leave Applications

Should a reason arise for your child to be absent from school for a period greater than 5 days, e.g. travel, an **application for extended leave** must be lodged with the Principal. Travel documentation, such as travel itinerary or e-ticket should be attached to the application. Application for Extended Leave forms can be requested through the front office or via email.


